Member Profile - Irene Kinder - Club Treasurer



After graduating from TAFE, I started my working life as an office junior for a construction supply company before leaving to work in life assurance as secretary to senior representatives and then Personal Assistant to the Queensland branch manager.

During this time, I travelled to New Zealand, South East Asia and parts of Europe enjoying the single life as well as being very involved in a political party holding the positions of Branch, Area and Campaign Secretary for a number of years and looking for a job that would challenge my energy and organisational skills.

I finally found one which changed my life in more ways than one - in consulting engineering - where I met my husband. The position was that of Personal Assistant to the Directors of an international consulting engineering firm and within 6 months, I was asked whether I would like to work as Executive Assistant/Office Manager to the Queensland Manager who travelled extensively and needed someone who was able to support him while he was in the office and especially during his absences. This was one of my happiest times having this responsibility, being able to make administrative decisions on the Director's behalf, organise client functions liaise with the Board of the firm as well as their clients and supervise administration assistants. However, after several years and in my 30s, we decided to start a family and I became a stay at home mum as my husband travelled extensively in Australia and abroad.

As our children grew and started their education, I became involved in their educational institutions firstly as President of a C&K Kindergarten and Preschool which had problems with meeting certain criteria to stay affiliated. With the support of a very hardworking committee, we managed to meet all criteria, make ourselves financially sound and improve the conditions for our children. One of the main areas of concern was the gravelled car park and lack of a decent footpath in front of the premises and after a lot of negotiation and meetings with the Brisbane City Council and their engineers, advice and ex gratia drawings from a Traffic Engineer who was a personal friend, I was able to secure a sealed car park including a new footpath, kerb and channelling. During our children's time there, I was also responsible for securing grants for appropriate fencing, drainage and playground equipment before leaving the centre in a very healthy financial position.

On to primary school and my husband's travelling increased, so I threw myself into the school's P&C fundraising and after a year was elected Vice-President, then President for the last 4 years with responsibility for 5 subcommittees, overcoming several major challenges which were presented. I secured another grant, this time for the refurbishment of the school tuckshop.

During my last year before moving on to the high school, the school celebrated its centenary. We made the decision to hold a fete and search for past students. We had the honour of welcoming back one past student who was 97 years old.

With our younger son's entry into high school came the realisation that my involvement with their education and their need for a constant parent was coming to an end as was my time as Music Support Group President and P&C Secretary. I re-entered the workforce and, as I had kept my skills up-to-date with my voluntary work, was able to make a smooth transition into full-time work as Personal Assistant in a well-known private school, then Executive Assistant to a CEO in hospitality before returning to my passion of engineering/construction.

From our home we have a very good view of the Gateway bridges and the constant reminder of the long hours and four happy years as Assistant to the Design Director on the Gateway Upgrade Project, supervising administration assistants, working with the Design Management Team, and the consulting engineers designing the bridge as well as the client, Queensland Motorways. I also had the responsibility of monitoring and keeping accurate records of the variations to the original project contract.

As the design part of the Gateway project came to an end, I transferred to Head Office for a short time and threw myself into organising a national design management conference, then onto another project as Project Launch Assistant being responsible for assisting with the setup of the new project, liaising with the client and supporting the Board.

As the project site was outside of Mackay and the Brisbane based portion of the project was coming to an end, I decided that it was time to retire and have now enjoyed a couple of years getting used to an empty nest, travelling, being involved with Zonta and VIEW and waiting for my constantly absent husband to come home.
