Our Irish Colleen...



I had a lovely start to life, the last of six children with the previous sibling being born five years before me, so in some people's eyes, I was a little mistake, but in my parent's eyes, even though I had nothing to do with it, I was affectionately known as their lucky child. Lucky, because after I was born things got better for my family, my father received a big promotion which more than doubled his pay and gave him six weeks paid holidays per year at a time when two weeks was standard and many didn't even get that. Lucky, because we were able to move into a larger house with three bedrooms (8 people lived in this house!), a living room and a separate kitchen and a front and back garden. (I sound a bit like the Four Yorkshire Men (*House? You were lucky to have a HOUSE! We used to live in one room, all hundred and twenty-six of us, no furniture. Half*

the floor was missing; we were all huddled together in one corner for fear of FALLING !!)

I grew up in Turf Lodge, Belfast just off the Falls Road, and much of my childhood was lived during 'The Troubles' so life was a bit unusual to say the least, but when this is your life, you adapt and still play hop-scotch on the streets and throw a rope up a light pole to make a swing.

In 1971 my eldest sister and brother and their families left for Australia and settled in Redbank Plains and Browns Plains and we followed in 1973. I lived at Park Ridge and attended Beaudesert State High when there were only about 500 students. We moved from Park Ridge to Goodna, three months before the end of Year 11 and I commuted from Goodna to Beaudesert every day, by Greyhound bus. I would pick it up from Rock-lea where my father worked and catch it back in the evenings. Instead of finishing Year 12 I left and went to Ipswich TAFE and got the equivalent of a Cert IV in secretarial skills and have been in Administration ever since.

I worked for the Blue Nursing Service (Blue Care) as a Fundraiser and Public Relations person, Office Manager for Toshiba Medical, Secretary to the State Manager for Frigrite and Primac, and for the past 20 years I have been with Brisbane Catholic Education.

I have three children, Róisín, Michaela and Eamon, who give me great pleasure and lots of love. I have lived at Cedar Grove for the past 26 years, and continue to have a very blessed and rich life because I am surrounded by good friends and a very close-knit family.
