# International Women's Day Lunch

## Queensland Women: Shaping the Future



Sunday March 9 attracted a full house at the annual International Women's Day Lunch. The theme aims to encourage women to look into themselves rather than at themselves and actions count for more than their looks. Proceeds from the lunch help support the Bowen Emergency Crisis Housing and Hope for the Children. The Club was pleased to present three excellent speakers from left Leshca Palmore, Vicki Saylor and Tracey Quadroy who are shaping the future of Queensland in a unique way.

**Lescha Palmore**, a local Bowen girl works as a senior legal officer with the Queensland Police Service. Lescha is also the Townsville coordinator for the new promising Queensland Indigenous Alcohol Diversionary Program. Apart from regularly appearing in court, Lescha liaises closely with the local Indigenous Elders, Townsville Community Justice Group and local rehabilitation providers.

**Vicki Saylor** is the first NQ actor to win an Australian Film Institute award for her performance as Flo, in the television drama Call Me Mum, which incidentally was her first acting job. Vicki also received the Bendigo Bank 2007 Business Women of the Year New Challenge Award for founding her own promotions and marketing business.

**Tracey Quadroy** is a local Bowen girl whose first teaching post on Palm Island changed the lives of many of its students. In 2003 Tracey's class of special education students won the Education Queensland's Showcase Awards for inclusive curriculum practices. In 2007 she was awarded a National Excellence in Teaching Award. Today she heads Special Education Services at Emerald North State School for children ranging from 10 weeks to 6 years of age with varying disabilities. Tracey is currently writing a book on the "The ASD Child - Strategies and Ideas".




# A New Pair of Feet in the Hansen House



#### **Inspiring Women**



Advocate for the health of Australia's Children

Professor Fiona Stanley is passionate about the health of Australian children. She has established a number of research programs which focuses on prevention and social causes of children's diseases. Fiona is a professor at the School of Paediatrics and Child Health at the University of WA.

In Dec 2007 she gave evidence at an inquest to Aboriginal deaths detailing many of the health problems facing Aboriginals, many of which could be prevented if conditions improved.

Fiona has many achievements which include:

- Companion of the Order of Australia for research in peri natal and infant problems and improving aboriginal and community health (Queen's Birthday Honour List)
- Founding director of the *Telethon Institute* for *Child Health Research* whose most important role was instigating the first public health campaign in the world to promote folate to prevent spina bifida in babies and becoming a leader in research to improve the health of Aboriginal children
- Overcaming her own medical battles with breast cancer in 1999
- Lobbying the government in 2002 to launch the Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth of which she is the CEO, whose aim is to significantly improve the health and well being of children and youth
- Australian of the Year award in 2003
- UNICEF ambassador for early childhood development
- National Trust's Australian Living Treasure

Fiona will participate in the Beijing Olympic Torch Relay on its way through Australia in April.

We should try to do something with our time on earth that will make Australia a better place for generations to come.

## From the Hen's Hutch



This delicious chocolate slice makes an excellent dessert for tea breaks during Zonta Club community activities and fund raisers.

#### **Double Chocolate Fudge Slice**

#### Ingredients

250 g butter 2 cups sugar 1 tsp vanilla 4 large eggs

1 cup plain flour plus 1 teaspoon

2/3 cup cocoa

34 tsp baking powder

½ cup nuts (macadamia or walnuts) 100 g quality dark cooking chocolate

#### Method

Combine melted butter, sugar and vanilla in large bowl and stir until combined. Beat in eggs till just blended.

Sift together plain flour, cocoa and baking powder. Add nuts. Fold into bowl with wet ingredients, till just blended. Do not over beat.

Spread mixture into a lined lamington tin and cover top evenly with roughly chopped cooking chocolate. Bake in 160 degree oven until just firm. Cut when warm and allow cooling in pan.
