Guests will hear Anne's extraordinary story of overcoming illness and


emotional obstacles to recover and win triathlons - even representing Australia.

# Queensland Healthy State Awards submission well under way

After the planning session on January 18 details of two projects are mapped out with plans for the third.

The notes from the discussions outline how the need for each project was identified, how the project was planned and the implementation and monitoring of each project.

In addition, each project identified the partnerships that have been, or are being, established to make the projects work.

The next step is to draft this information into the Award format. The final draft will come to the membership before sending off.

On the swimming vouchers idea, Robyn and Carole have found out that:

- On average 14 children aged 0 4 years drown each year in Queensland
- Two thirds of these drowning cases are children aged one and two years of age



 For every toddler drowning three or four others are admitted to hospital following an immersion incident.

They also discovered from ABS estimates that there were 1,002 children aged 0 to 4 in the Whitsundays in June 2007 (523 boys and 479 girls).

Swimming lessons cost \$110 per child for 10 lessons and we estimate 20 lessons on average for drown-proofing.

The total cost for this comes out at about \$220,000. A nice round sum and one which allows others to share in the prize money too!

## World Wide Women

Muslim Women in the Gulf States are facing an extreme increase in the number of divorces by sms text. According to The Gulf Daily Women Organisations in Bahrain are demanding a quick new law to protect women and families against this "spontaneously and inhuman" way of divorcing. "A man who wants to divorce is obliged first to tell his wife. We think that they have to decide together and certainly not by sms," says Fatima al-Rabeca of Bahrain's Women's Organisation. Also in Asia and Africa the sms way of divorcing is making progress. It seems that Judges don't have any understanding of the situation. A judge in Malaysia accepted a divorce where a man by sms ordered his wife: when you are not coming to me immediately, the divorce is a fact. According to the Islamic law the Sharia, if a man, in the presence of a witness, declares three times that he wants to divorce, a judge will usually confirm this.

# Lucy gains worldwide notoriety!

Lucy Fraser, from the Whitsundays, has gained worldwide notoriety through being photographed celebrating Barack Obama's inauguration in his village of Kogelo, in Kenya.

Lucy, who is supported by both Zonta and Rotary in the Whitsundays, has been in Kenya helping to build a community centre and doing other voluntary work.

The photograph has appeared in newspapers and on websites all over the world. Lucy sent in the following touching story about her friend Moses.

"I can't finish talking about this week without mentioning one thing. This year I actually got to experience a Xmas miracle first-hand. We have a dear friend called Moses who lives in Mutumbu. He is one of the two young men who run the community centre, which we have now finished building for them. He is funny, smart and a real genuine person. He taught us how to use the Jemba and a lot about trees as well as giving us language lessons in the local mother tongue, Luo.

On Xmas eve he was travelling into Kisumu when the Matatu he was in crashed with two other vehicles. He was in the front seat and the two people next to him were killed. Moses walked out of the hospital that same afternoon with nothing but a few bruises and scratches. I guess the universe still had a plan for him, and when it's not your time, it's not your time. I believe someone was looking out for him. Every day since then we thank our lucky stars that such an amazing person is still with us when he could have so easily been lost.

I also got to give one of the most meaningful Xmas presents I could give. Moses has awful eyesight and his glasses were broken/lost in the crash, it would have taken him months if not a year to save the money to buy a new pair, so I used some of the money my parents gave me (thanks mum and dad!) to buy him a pair, which he then was able to wear to our final day on the worksite (which was a big day of speeches and more speeches). He has done so much for us over the last two months, so it was a good way to show him how much we care about him and what he has meant to us! A Christmas miracle if ever there was one!

# Service and Advocacy Report

What a busy year we have had so far with our very successful **film evening** on the 29th January, our **planning session** on the 18th January and the **garden and library committees** in top gear.

Our documentary, A Walk to Beautiful was shown at Connie's "gold class" cinema on the 29th January with a wonderful attendance and an abundance of good food and wine. The film lasted just 45 minutes but was wonderfully inspiring and educated us even more about the condition of Obstetric Fistula, one of the focuses of Zonta International this year. An animated discussion ensued after the film and a great evening was had by all who attended. Thanks to Connie for supplying the venue and being the perfect hostess and to Robyn for supplying the film.



A **planning session** was held at Robyn's house on the 18th January to discuss the projects and strategies needed to enter the **Qld Healthy State Awards**. It was established that two of our current projects, the garden project and the library project, fit nicely with the criteria and a third, a physical activity, would be added.

The dynamic **garden committee** has held many meetings over the last few weeks as planting season is not far away and gardens need to be built at the refuge by then. The committee has been very proactive with the implementation and monitoring of their project. A model garden design has been established, including a bush tucker garden, and 'sow what when' guides, crop rotation guides and companion planting guides examined, and a site plan drawn up for the Whitsunday Crisis & Counselling Service Refuge. Budgets are now being finalised which will form the basis of model gardens in the future. The committee has set an ambitious target of starting their garden at the Whitsunday Crisis & Counselling Service Refuge and then expanding to the local schools and later into a council-funded facility like the Botanic Gardens. A funding application has been submitted to ABC Rural Radio Healthy Community Grant, so fingers crossed that extra funding will be successful. This committee has been so inspirational that I think all the members should dust off their gardening gloves and get out into the garden to grow veggies and get healthy!!!!

The Library Committee, with the help of Anna Durham at the Cannonvale library, are about to prepare their list of books for purchase, keeping in mind our focus on the healthy state awards criteria. I, for one, am looking forward to selecting many of the new books about to become part of our shire library, thanks to our Library Committee.

Our new committee, **The Walking Project Committee**, will be holding meetings in February to examine the logistics of establishing a walking club etc. Wendy is heading up that committee at the moment so stay tuned for more action on our 'get physical' project.

YWPA judging will take place in February and a winner announced who will then be a speaker at the IWDB.

Education Bursary Committee is meeting on the 18th February to develop an action plan for 2009. Ashleigh, the 2008 winner, will attend our February meeting and also at the February meeting we look forward to hearing Libby speak of her Rock and Water Course.
