## **ADVOCACY**



"Hidden Figures"-- what a wonderful film! Thank you Roz for putting this film forward and thank you Laura for hosting us once again. The stoicism of these women was amazing. Not only did they have to battle being women-they were also African-American women. Segregation was a part of American life at this time. It was a part of our own Australian history too where Aboriginals were banned from certain sections of our community. Fortunately, these women weren't "put aside" by everyone. The immigrant engineer who encouraged the young engineer and the Judge who had the courage to award her a place in school: the boss of NASA who made changes to make Catherine's life as a Coloured woman easier and finally, his acceptance of her genius. Of course there were many negatives facing these young women. For me, the one that stood out was once again the young engineer whose husband was questioning who she thought she was---- what made her think that she could achieve such things. After all, she was a woman and a coloured woman. Thank goodness he saw sense!! And she had the courage to proceed. But it wasn't only men who opposed these women---- other women did as well and it is still the case today.

A lot has changed since the 1960's regarding gender equality but we still have a long way to go. This brings me to the UN International Literacy Day. This was first celebrated on 8th September 1967. It is

50 years since this first celebration and is now celebrated worldwide bringing together governments, multi and bi lateral organisations, NGO's, private sectors, communities, teachers, learners and experts in the field.

"The world has changed since 1966 (when International Literacy Day was first proclaimed) but our determination to provide every woman and man with the skills, capacities and opportunities to become everything they wish, in dignity and respect, remains as firm as ever. Literacy is a foundation to build a more sustainable future for all." UNESCO Director General.

According to the Indian Express newspaper, UNESCO has reported positive trends toward growing literacy levels in children but not adults.

"The wider population has not benefitted to the same extent in some regions. It is a troubling fact that there are now more adults without literacy compared to 50 years ago meaning that our efforts have not kept pace with population growth." Quian Tang. UNESCO Education Assistant Director General.

However, UNESCO is still aiming for 2030 to "ensure inclusive and quality education for all and promote lifelong education".

As a NGO member of the UN, Zonta International promotes education of women and girls. This is done in many ways in many countries around the world. One such country is Liberia where ZI has been supporting the fistula program since 2008. Education has been the key in the success of this program --- educating women, girls and the wider community-- teaching them that this is an unnecessary women's health issue. Literacy has been a major part of this education. Many of the girls who have been helped in the past are now educators in their own villages. ZI continues to work with the Liberian government--- continuing to educate-- continuing to empower women. It is truly a success story.

ZI is currently partnering with UNICEF USA and the Ministry of National Education for "Let us Learn Madagascar" which creates opportunities for vulnerable and excluded girls to realise their rights to education in a secure and protective environment. There is a lot about this program on the ZI website.

ZI has also been part of the education of girls in Niger in a bid to delay early marriage.

Today we not only have illiteracy as we have known it (the inability to read and write) but we have the digital world to contend with. (And you know about my love for Dropbox!!!) With an estimated 750 million adults (of which 2/3 are women) still lacking the most basic of literacy skills, we still have a long way to go to reach the UN Sustainable Development Goal (SDG4) which aims to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" by 2030. ZI is a proud partner and supporter of the UN and it's organisations in our implementation and support of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Of course, our own club promotes further education for our local girls by offering education bursaries and encouragement to those suffering hardship and with our first Z Club up and running at St. Catherine's College, our involvement with girl's education on a local level will only grow.

September 21st is UN International Day of World Peace. One can only pray!! Maxine Thiele, Director.


