
#### **Editorial**

Continuing this Gender Equality theme in this edition: Our 'reviews' of the Barbie Movie; Equal Pay Day: #EndGenderBias Survey.

I have also been interested in gender equality issues raised through FIFA Women's World Cup. We saw Australian fans embrace women's football – certainly for the spectacle of the games, but also what it stands for: women's empowerment, gender equality and inclusiveness. Yet we have noted the prize money gender gap, and the unacceptable behaviour of Spanish federation chief Luis Rubiales. The Matildas called out FIFA's tournament payment being \$483 million less than the men, and stood up for nations who do not have the right of collective bargaining for wages and working conditions. If gender inequality can be tackled in sport, we are encouraged to continue to tackle this in the wider community.

#### Service




Birthing Kits were assembled by students / teachers at Cannon Hill Anglican College (CHAC), and our Zonta members on 17th August. The assembly event was very successful. Many students had attended in previous vears and were prepared; those who hadn't attended before were shown the ropes by their experienced buddies. 400 kits were packed (200 funded by Zonta Brisbane East and 200 funded by from CHAC). Initially we were a little concerned that the kits contained gloves that were of an extra small size, however, on enquiry with the BKFA, we learned that

all kits are destined for the Pygmy people who average 1.52 m (5ft) height and have small hands.



A group of Zonta members attended the Barbie Movie, and then enjoyed discussing our reactions. Here are our reviews:

"I liked a lot of the clever dialogues and the clear depiction of reversed, gender realities."

"It was inspiring to observe the Barbie world, where women held all positions of power. I particularly liked the part where one character,



who was talking to the Supreme Court, said she was feeling emotional about a particular topic, but that it did not diminish her power, it increased it."

"The flipped script brings the world and reality of women into focus and allows for that to be seen more clearly. It is not a man hating movie but a clever witty approach to tackling the topic of gender inequality."

"A very clever way to focus on gender equality. Barbie suggests that giving a voice to the cognitive dissonance of being a woman in a patriarchal society will diminish that system's power. That really resonated for me".

#### Items of Interest

#### **Equal Pay Day**

August 25<sup>th</sup> marked Equal Pay Day, calculated by Workplace Gender Equality Agency, marks the 56 additional days from the end of the financial year that women must work to earn the same average wage. In February 2023, average gender pay gap was \$253/week; \$13,183/year. At the average rate of pay for women, this is equivalent to 8 weeks additional paid work (56 days). #### #EndGenderBias survey

The National Women's Health Advisory Council provides the Australian Government with advice and recommendations to improve health outcomes for women in Australia. Current evidence suggests women often suffer poorer health results, with delayed diagnosis, overprescribing, and failure to properly investigate symptoms. The National Women's Health Advisory Council wish to hear from women to better understand barriers and gender bias women face in our healthcare system.
