Her experiences of the orphanages and the 'death rooms' where children, often girls and the disabled, are ignored to death as it is not considered economic to spend the resources to keep them alive. Millions of children are in this category.

She also told us about a foster home which is offering hope for a small number of these children. I am sure many Zontians went home and hugged their children/grand children after hearing Anna's experiences.

Well, Pat has been hard at work and has cut out a further 66 cushions which will need pinning, sewing, filling, hand sewing and wrapping over the next few weeks.

We sent off 8 cushions to Logan Hospital and 41 to the Mater Private. So you can see that we need to keep ensuring that we have a supply ready for these hospitals.

Well, I have survived my first month in Melbourne. The weather has not been as bad as expected - only two days of rain - however, it is 38 one day and 22 the next - I have never watched the weather reports so much in my life.

I am madly running around town every weekend looking for a place to buy but there is so little on the market - I do hope I will have something sorted out in the next month. So, in the meantime I am staying in the lovely Monash university accommodation of a rather salubrious original 1960s red brick flat which is located in an area colloquially known as Saigon City - quite a change from the leafy surrounds of Brisbane's western suburbs! Oh well, it is character building!

Teaching is going well. I have only 700 students in my first year unit - about half of which are international. At the moment they still have that wide-eyed, stunned look of trying to comprehend a new country, start of university etc. 90% of them attend lectures and they seem very receptive. I also have a masters class (about 3/4 international students). It is very multicultural and diverse here - just call me Skippy!

I am working with two colleagues on a proposal to put to Bluescope for joint collaboration in China. I will be going to China for two weeks in June. So, all in all, I am very busy but excited by new things to do! There is a very nice organisational culture here - academics do work hard but it is very equitable and the staff are very collegial.

I may be in Brisbane at Easter time - if yes, I will let you know soon.

## International Project 2004-2006

The International Service projects for the 2004-2006 Biennium focus on urgent issues in three parts of the world: Niger, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Afghanistan.

- Women now account for almost half of all cases of HIV/AIDS in the world. The impact of HIV/AIDS is so devastating in the Bouza District of the Tahoua Department (state) in Southern Niger, that the district is known as "the Valley of the Widows" because of the high number of young married men who have died in recent years.
- In late 2000, the International Police Task Force of Bosnia estimated that over 10,000 victims of trafficking are in the country at any one time. Local women's groups estimate that more than 95 percent of these are women.
- Only 3 percent of Afghan women are literate; and the majority of women have no access to clean water, energy or sanitation. For almost six years, Afghan women were completely removed from social, economic and political life, and virtually all of their human rights have been violated.

## International Service Program

Women's equality is not yet a reality. Women worldwide face systemized discrimination - they lack opportunities to live healthy lives, free from legal, social, economic and political inequality.

In sub-Saharan Africa, 57% of adults with HIV are women and young women 15 to 24 are more than three times as likely to be infected as young men.

Globally, more than 80% of women do not have sufficient knowledge about HIV/AIDS and many women do not have the power to say no to sex with an infected partner.

Every year an estimated 4 million women and girls are bought and sold worldwide.

More than 59 million school-aged girls are not in school and female illiteracy rates remain higher than men

About 530,000 women die annually in pregnancy or during childbirth, mainly due to lack of access to health care.
